# ST BRIGID'S REPORT FOR TERM 3 – SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

#### **FAITH**

- On 6 August 2019 our Year 6 students attended the annual Mass with Bishop Brian Mascord.
   The students were to be congratulated for their full and active participation in the Mass they were simply awesome!
- Our Year 4 students sat the annual Religious Literacy Assessment and we await the results.
- The Principal, Assistant Principal and Religious Education Coordinator all attended an overnight retreat facilitated by Fr Richard Leonard sj at the Hermitage in Mittagong. This is always a wonderful opportunity for stillness, solitude and growth.
- Our Year 3 students and their families have ben preparing for the Sacrament of First Eucharist. Our students had a lovely half day retreat at school prepared by the classroom teachers.
- In Week 10 we launched the Acknowledgement Wall painted by Uncle Kevin Butler. It was a very special occasion for our community.

#### JUSTICE

- Our staff and parent commitment to the Vinnies Van continues with 4 staff teams and two
  parent teams involved in this important local outreach. Our school community hosts a drive
  each term for the Vinnies Van to provide much needed goods.
- Once again we were able to support our local parish Vinnies conference with a donation of \$1800 for the annual winter appeal, as well as a food drive. It is a great partnership that continues to grow from strength to strength.
- This year for the first time we participated in the St Vincent de Paul Hand Me Ups fundraiser.
   The results were not perfect, with some donations having to be put in the bin, however, with all the donations collected in the Blue Bin, we assisted in generating \$939.00 for Vinnies.

#### **LEARNING**

- One of our School Review and Improvement goals this year is around the implementation of the new Science and Technology Curriculum. Students have been working on great projects involving plugged and unplugged resources. We hosted a STEM open day on Monday 23 September to see our Science learning in action. STEM is an approach to learning and development that integrates the areas of science, technology, engineering and

- Staff have been working on writing a School Wide Vision for learning which hopefully will be published at the end of this term, if not early 2021.

#### OTHER

- The Year 5 and 6 students had a wonderful time at the three-day Residential Outdoor Education Camp, conducted by NSW Sport and Recreation at Berry. The overall aim of the camp was to enhance the students' leadership skills, increase their confidence in their own abilities and assist them in learning to cooperate and work with others through controlled experiences. The activities of team building, problem solving, innovation, adventure challenge games, trust and support certainly ensured that everyone had a great time.
- What a huge success our 2019 biennial school Fete was. It is a mammoth effort for our community to stage such an event, but the result was outstanding. With only a few minor outstanding bills still to be paid we should make a profit of approximately \$14500.
- As part of the Catholic Education Diocese of Wollongong (CEDoW) Principal Professional Development Planning and Review Process, an Appraisal occurs for each Principal every four years. This provides system and community accountability that is aligned with the School and Improvement process, focusing on the Principal's leadership achievements and strengths, as well as identify areas for growth and development and future directions. My Appraisal occurred on the 4 September 2019. Parents participated via a short survey, 12 staff were interviewed, and all staff surveyed, 12 students were interviewed, and Fr Bernard was interviewed. I wish to thank the community for their support and positive feedback.
